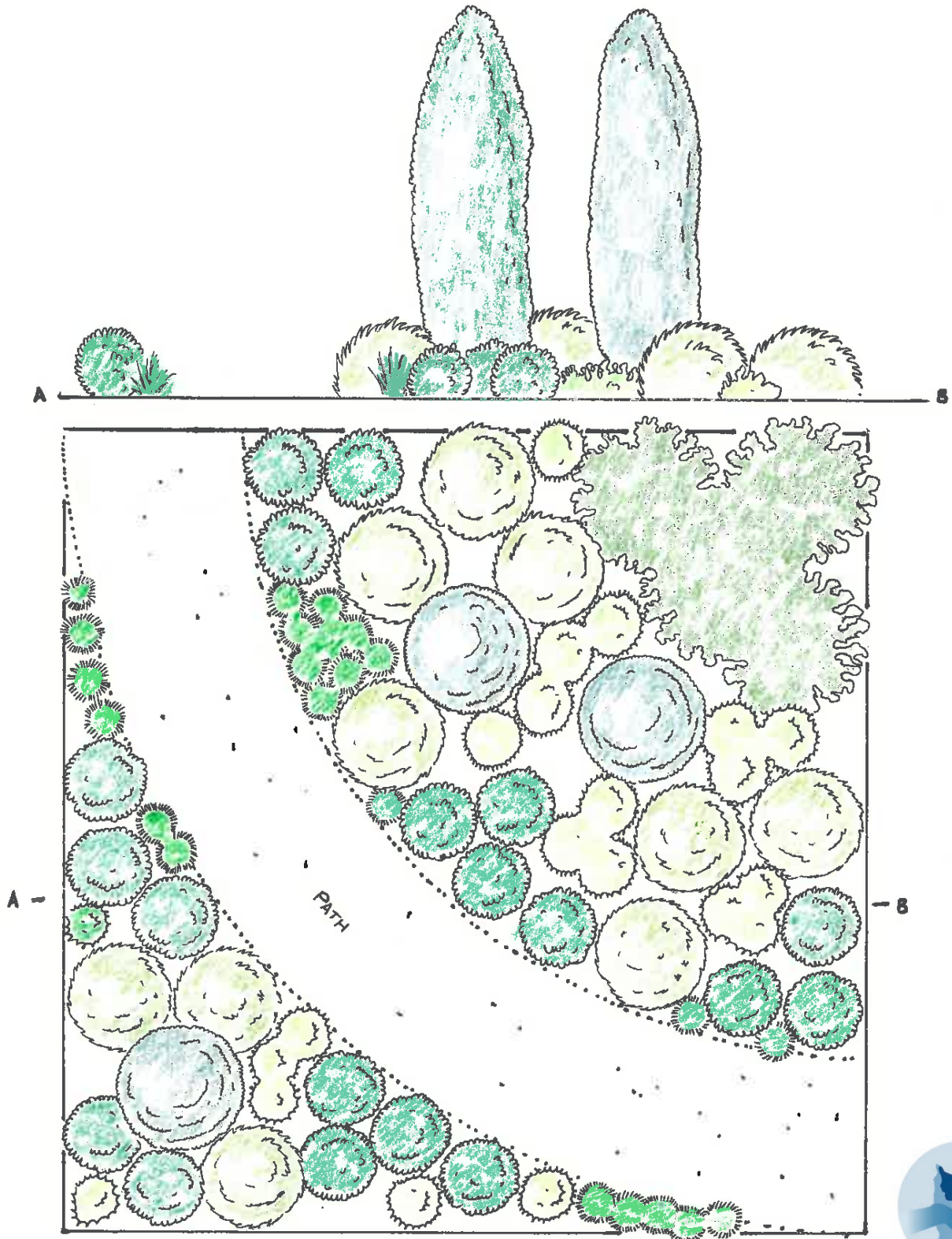




Garden Design **Pimelea**

Garden Design **Pimelea**

This garden concept relies on plants that have a strong, geometric form. Referencing gardens of southern Europe but using Western Australian plants. The trees would be tall, narrow and naturally columnar in the same way that Pencil Pines would be used in an Italian context. The shrubs would

be naturally rounded but would look best if clipped into spheres. To create visual interest, it is important to contrast foliage of the different spheres. The pathway can be made from either limestone or cracked gravel depending on the home owner's preference.
